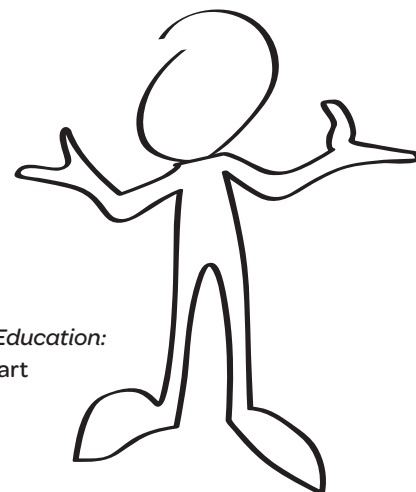


Save Well
